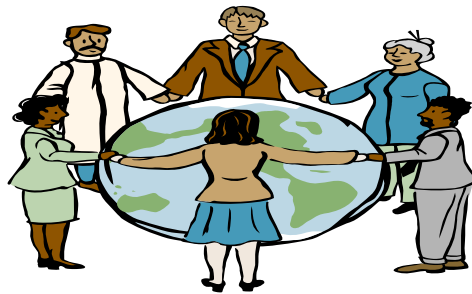

History and Purpose

In July of 2005 resident leaders came together at a summit at Northeastern University to educate themselves in order to challenge a series of local, state and national legislation, rules and policies that are unfair and punitive to low-income families. *With the realization that there is a strong movement to eliminate low-income and public housing across the United States,* resident leaders feel they must come together and form a citywide jurisdiction council (Tenant Senate) to create a movement themselves

Purpose:

- To Empower and Organize public housing tenants against unfair rules, regulations and policies,
- To Distribute information to each tenant
- To Educate , Advocate and Provide for families and neighbors
- To Represent all 68 developments, subsidized housing and Section 8 tenants
